The last of the خير القرون (Golden Generation) to leave this world

Sayyidunā ‘Abdullāh ibn Mughaffal رضي الله عنه narrates that the Messenger of Allāh صلى الله عليه وسلم said:
(Fear) “Allāh, (Fear) Allāh! Regarding my Companions! Do not make them targets of your criticism after me. Whoever loves them, it is out of love of me that he loves them; and whoever hates them, it is out of hatred for me that he hates them. Whoever harms them, he has harmed me; and whoever harms me, he has offended Allāh. And whoever offends Allāh, he shall soon be punished.”





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The last Şahābī to pass away in
Makkah Al Mukarramah

‘Āmir ibn
Wāṭhilah
Al-Kinānī



He was born in the 3rd year after Hijrah.

He was the last Şahābī to pass away from the galaxy of Şahābah.

He was from among the leaders of his community.

He also possessed an extreme level of intellect and was a master at poetry.

He resided in Kūfah however relocated to Makkah Al-Mukarramah after the passing on of ‘Alī ibn Abī Ṭālib

He passed away in the year 102 A.H.



The last Şahābī to pass away in
Al-Madīnah Al-Munawwarah

Sahl ibn

Sa'd ﷺ

His name was originally Ḥuzn
which means sadness.

Nabī ﷺ changed it to Sahl.

He was 15 years old when Nabī ﷺ
passed away.

He narrated 188 Aḥādīṭh.

He passed away in the year 88
A.H at the age of 100 years.



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The last Ṣaḥābī to pass away in
Al-Madīnah Al-Munawwarah

Jābir Ibn
'Abdillāh Al-
Anṣārī ﷺ

He accepted Islām before the Hijrah.

Imām Muslim transmits from Jābir ﷺ who said, "I fought in nineteen battles with the Messenger of Allāh ﷺ, but I did not fight in Badr and Uḥud because my father stopped me. When my father was martyred in Uḥud, I did not stay behind from the Messenger of Allāh ﷺ in any battle."

He narrated 1540 aḥādīth. He passed away in 74 Hijrī at the age of 94.

Second view - According to some scholars, he was the last Ṣaḥābī to pass away in Madīnah.

He is buried In Baqī'.



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The last Şahābī to pass away in
Khurāsān

Buraydah
Al-Aslamī 



He embraced Islām when Nabī ﷺ passed by his area on his way to Al-Madīnah Al-Munawwarah during Hijrah.

He participated in 16 expeditions with Nabī ﷺ.

He later moved to Baṣrah.

Nabī ﷺ mentioned to him that he will be one who the people of the east will benefit from. This prophecy was fulfilled when he joined the expedition to Khurāsān where he remained and passed away.

He passed away in the year 63 A.H.





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The last Şahābī to pass away in
Başrah

Anas ibn
Mālik ﷺ



He was born 10 years before
Hijrah.

His mother was Umm Sulaym ﷺ.
She left him in the service of
Nabī ﷺ for the duration of
Nabī ﷺ's life in Al Madīnah Al
Munawwarah.

Nabī ﷺ made du'ā to Allāh Ta'ālā
to bless him in his age and
progeny.

He narrated 2 286 Aḥādīth.

He passed away in Başrah in the
year 90 A.H.

He was over 100 years old.



The last Ṣahābī to pass away in
Kūfah

'Abdullāh ibn
Abī Aufā ﷺ



The name of 'Abdullāh ibn Abī
Awfā was 'Alqamah ibn Khālid.

He participated in the pledge of
Riḍwān and took part in the
battle of Khaybar and the
expeditions that followed.

After the demise of the
Messenger of Allāh ﷺ, he came
to Kūfah where he passed away
in 86 Hijrī.

He narrated 95 Aḥādīth.



The last **Ṣahābī** to pass away in
Syria

'**Abdullāh Ibn
Busr**
Al-Aslamī ﷺ



He was from among those who performed ṣalāh in the direction of both Qiblahs.

The Messenger of Allāh ﷺ once placed his hand on his head and made the following du'ā for him, "This boy will live for a century."

He narrated 50 aḥādīth.

He passed away in 88 A.H at the age of 100.

The last Şahābī to pass away in
Ḥimş (Area within Syria)

Abū Umāmah
Şudayy ibn 'Ajlān
Al-Bāhilī

He lived in Syria and passed
away in Ḥimş in 81 Hijrī.

He narrated 250 aḥādīth.



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The last of the 10 Şahābah who
were given glad tidings of Jannah
in one gathering:

Sa'd ibn Abī
Waqqaş ﷺ

He was the conqueror of Iraq and Madā'in.

He was one of the six Şahābah specified by 'Umar ﷺ for the Khilāfah after him.

He accepted Islām during the early stages and was from among the first emigrants.

He participated in Badr and the battles thereafter.

The Messenger of Allāh ﷺ made the following du'ā' for him, "O Allāh, straighten his aim and accept his du'ā'".

He used to guard the Messenger of Allāh during the battles.

He was also the first Şahābī to fire an arrow in the path of Allāh.

He narrated 270 Aḥādīth.

He passed away in the year 55 A.H at the age of 70 and is buried in Al-Madīnah Al-Munawwarrah.



Last wife of Nabī ﷺ to pass away

Umm Al-Mu'minīn
Umm Salamah
Hind Bint Abī
Umayyah ؓ

She was one of the early people to embrace Islām.

She was the first woman to migrate to Abyssinia.

Nabī ﷺ married her after her husband Abū Salamah ؓ passed on from wounds inflicted during the battle of Uḥud.

Nabī ﷺ sought her council on the day of Ḥudaybiyyah (where she told him not to speak until he slaughters and shaves his hair).

She narrated 378 Aḥādīth.

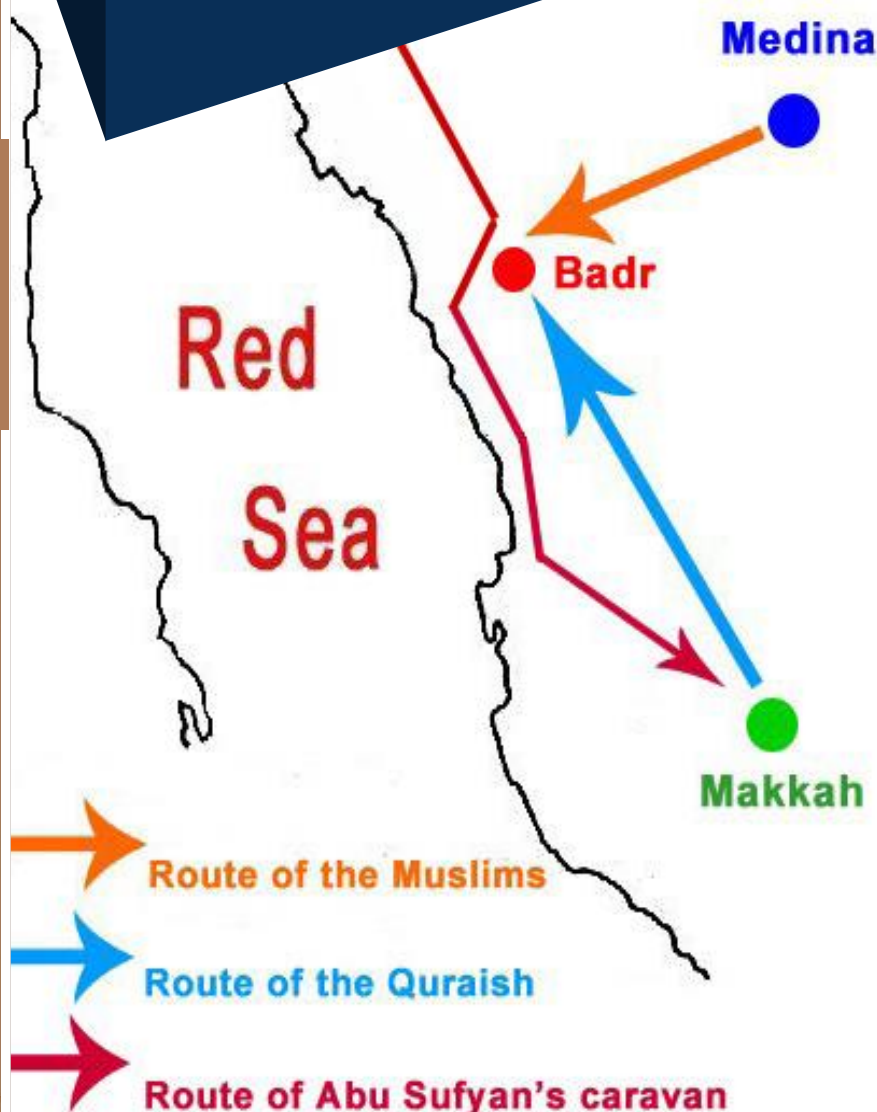
She passed away in the year 60 A.H.



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Last of the Ṣaḥābah who
participated in Badr to pass away

**Abū Usayd Mālīk
ibn Rabī'ah
Al-Sā'idī**



Abū Usayd Mālīk ibn Rabī'ah Al-Sā'idī رضي الله عنه participated in the Battle of Badr, Uḥud and all the other expeditions, making him from amongst the most eminent of Muslims.

28 aḥādīth are narated from him.

According to the Ḥadīth scholar Ibn 'Abdul Barr رحمه الله he was the last of the Ṣaḥābah who participated in Badr to pass away.

He was 75 at the time of his demise and passed away in Al-Madīnah Al-Munawwarrah.
